Expanding the Horizons of Texas History

The eighth annual Battle of San Jacinto Symposium will feature the following speakers and topics:

STEPHEN HARRIGAN,

Historical Fact, Historical Fiction: Early Texas Through a Novelist's Eyes. Harrigan is the author of *Gates of the Alamo*, a *New York Times* best-seller and winner of the Spur Award for the Best Novel of the West. He is on the faculty of the James A. Michener Center for Writers at the University of Texas.

MIGUEL ÁNGEL GONZÁLEZ QUIROGA,

Commonality & Conflict: Northeast Mexico and the Texas Revolution and Republic. Gonzalez-Quiroga, who has had careers in the military, in politics and in academia, is currently a professor of history at the Universidad Autónoma de Nuevo León in Monterrey.

BETSY DAVIS,

Making History Personal. Davis is an Austin fourth grade teacher whose ability to bring Texas history to life for her students has won awards from the Austin Historical Society and the Austin Federation of Teachers.

DREANNA BELDEN,

Exploring the Texas Revolution Online through the Portal to Texas History. Belden will pull digital materials on file at The Portal to Texas History, a website sponsored by the University of North Texas that contains material from 70 collaborative partners. Belden is coordinator for grants and development at UNT libraries.

STUART REID,

The Secret War for Texas: James Grant's Alternative Revolution. Reid is a Scot, the author of *The Secret War for Texas*, and the great-great-great grandson of his book's elusive protagonist. He will discuss the Texas Revolution in the context of the "great game" played out during the first half of the nineteenth century between Washington and London over mastery of the North American continent.

JAMES E. CRISP,

associate professor of history at North Carolina State University and award-winning author of *Sleuthing the Alamo*, will moderate the Symposium.

The Battle of San Jacinto Symposium is sponsored by the Friends of the San Jacinto Battleground as a forum for promoting public awareness of the events of the Texas Revolution era.

The Friends of the San Jacinto Battleground is the assumed name for the San Jacinto Battleground Association, a Section 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation whose purposes are to preserve, protect and promote the San Jacinto Battleground as a state historic site and educate the public about the Battle of San Jacinto and the Texas Revolution era. In addition to the Symposium, the Friends supports archeological projects, marsh restoration, educational programs, land acquisition, the annual San Jacinto Day commemoration and battle reenactment, restoration of the interior of the Battleship *Texas* and other historic preservation projects at the battleground. The Friends is an organization separate and distinct from the San Jacinto Museum of History Association and the Battleship Texas Foundation.
